April 18, 2015

Backpack for Hunger Breakfast-Ulen – Living Grace joined other ELCA congregations (GPR

Parish, Salem-Hitterdal, Bethlehem-Ulen, Wild Rice Parish, Glyndon Lutheran).

The event raised over \$10,000.

September 2015

flannel blankets for House. We have volunteered several times preparing dinner.

Summer 2016

We secured a \$5,000 grant from Trinity Foundation. This grant was used to increase/improve areas of ministry, including musical ministry, evangelism and reaching out to new people in

the community and other ministry-enhancing projects.

Sept.11, 2016

Hosted a 9/11 Pancake Breakfast open to the community at the Garrick Theater

honoring/thanking military and emergency personnel.

October 2016

From 2011 up to and including YR 2016, ELCA churchwide has provided \$113,500 in

partnership support.

November 2016

Men began a woodworking ministry, making olivewood crosses in Dave Gausman's shop.

The crosses were sold and given as gifts to confirmation youth.

December 11, 2016

Bishop Larry Wohlrabe joined Living Grace to celebrate 5-year anniversary. In 5 Years: 2

Babies were Baptized, 4 Youth were Confirmed, 2 Youth received First Communion, 3 funerals, 250+ Sunday Services, 20 Holy Day Services (Christmas Eve. Maundy Thursday, Good Friday), Partnered with REACH and other ELCA congregations raising over \$20,000 to help the Backpack Program, Helped local family celebrate Christmas in 2014; helped families through Ronald McDonald House in 2015/2016.

- In an effort to continue raising awareness of Living Grace, Pr. Hope began serving on the NWMN Synod Council; wrote articles for *Hawley Herald* about Living Grace and our events/projects; attended Hawley Ministerial events.
- The past two years have been a time of exploration and transition. From June 2015-May 31, 2016 the NW MN ELCA Synod contracted with Living Grace for half of Pr. Hope's time as they had just lost their communication's coordinator. In September, Bishop Larry Wohlrabe suggested we consider a contract with Bethlehem Lutheran in Ulen, MN to help with part-time interim ministry for 6 months.

2017 Highlights:

- March 2017: GPR and Living Grace entered into a Ministry Partnership. The partnership includes Pr. Hope serving half-time at GPR and continuing half-time at Living Grace. The partnership is about thriving in ministry together! A Monthly Mutual Ministry Team (with representatives from all 4 congregations) began meeting monthly. The Mutual Ministry set these initial goals for our collaboration: 1). To have joint worship services and events, intentionally inviting one another into each other's space. We have done this through special events, open houses, Lenten services, Viking Park Outdoor Parish Worship service; Gran's Patriotic Service and annual auction/bake sale; Movie Nights at The Garrick Theater, etc. and 2). Pr. Hope to be present in all 4 churches; and Pr. Jim to be more present at Living Grace.
- June 2017 Pentecost Sunday, Living Grace held an Open House inviting Gran-Park-Rollag members. It was very well attended by all 4 congregations!
- July 2017 We worshipped together at GPR Parish's Outdoor Service at Viking Park.
- Youth came together for Luther League, preparing for the National Youth Gathering.
- Women from Living Grace, Gran, Park, Rollag congregations explored the possibilities of gathering for fellowship, studying God's Word, and serving others.

2018 Highlights:

- May 2018: Women's Mutual Ministry Kick-Off Event held at Garrick Theater featuring Taunya Todd; theme: Growing in Faith. During 2018, a Women's Mutual Ministry Team was developed to support current ministries and help evolve other ways that women from all four congregations and the community could grow in their faith and support one another. Women Held bi-monthly One Night Book Discussions: Present Over Perfect by Shauna Niequist; Christian Atheist by Craig Groeschel (became a weekly adult bible study unconnected to women's ministry); When God Doesn't Fix It by Laura Story; March: Unexpected by Christine Kaine; May: Sensible Shoes: A Story about the Spiritual Journey by Sharon Garlough Brown. Bi-monthly/monthly Bible Discussions at local restaurants/churches. The women also hosted Faith and Creativity Retreats; a Spiritual Retreat, events to collect purses/bags for women, men and youth that were distributed to REACH-Hawley and Mary's Place-Detroit Lakes.
- May 2018: We have also come together to create a Pocket Prayer Shawl Ministry, distributing over 700 little
 prayer shawls at the 2018 NWMN Synod Assembly, funerals, community services and individuals at the four
 churches. GPR and Living Grace partnered with Bethlehem Lutheran in Ulen to make over 600 pocket prayer
 shawls for the NW MN 2018 Synod Assembly.
- June 2018: Living Grace sent 5 people (4 youth and Pastor Hope) to the National Youth Gathering.
- Fall 2018: Joint dinner at Ella Marie's Café food and fellowship building a bigger table!
- The partnership has not only started breaking down walls, but we have also come together for fun, food and fellowship for a variety of activities and events, including: taking a bus trip to see Twins Games; eating dinner together at Ella Marie's Café; youth have attended the 2018 National Youth Gathering, Middle School Gathering, and participated in fundraisers and outreach activities together.

2019 Highlights:

- Participated with GPR Parish in the NWMN ELCA Synod's Practicing Resurrection: Congregational Vitality 2.0 with Rev. Dr. Rick Morse, from the Hope Partnership for Missional Transformation.
- Summer Evening Worship/Fellowship Events (Tuesday evenings dinner and worship)
- Women's Mutual Ministry Events: Winter Breakfast and Collection of Purses; Mother-Daughter Heirloom Tea Event; Faith and Creativity Retreat; Bible Studies/Book Studies
- GPR/Living Grace Youth opportunities: Confirmation, Synod gatherings, fundraising events and special activities.
- Regular Sunday morning Worship (September-May); Tuesday Evenings (June-July-August)
- Hartford Homes Bible study (Third Thursday of each month, open to community)
- Pr. Hope provides a Bible study at Northside Terrace on the 5th Tuesdays of a month.
- God's Work, Our Hands Outreach activities.
- Serving meals at Ronald McDonald House
- Youth helped distribute SNAP Food Box Distribution in October
- Pr. Hope serves on the REACH Board; several members volunteer at the REACH thrift store!

2020 Highlights:

- As 2020 offered us challenges in the midst of living into and being the church outside the building during a pandemic, it also offered us opportunities: how could we find ways to be together and carry out our mission of serving our neighbors, even if health officials suggested we physically distance, wear masks and care for one another?
- March 2020: Living Grace and GPR began an Online Ministry offering weekly worship services through
 Facebook, www.livinggracehawley.org, www.gprparish.org, and our YouTube Channel. We also provided Holy
 Week, Christmas and youth-related specials. Our YouTube Channel now has over 100 subscribers. As well, our
 weekly Wednesday morning Bible study was on Zoom.
- Pr. Hope, having a background in documentary producing (audio/video editing), was able to edit pre-recorded worship services. Tech support from Rollag Lutheran's Brent Helgeson, Austin Peterson and Sophie Helgeson made it possible to provide this service.
- **Women's Mutual Ministry:** On February 16, 2020, a Purse & Tea Event was held where we gathered and assembled 75 purses and bags for REACH to distribute to women, men and youth in need. In March, women took to Zoom to hold weekly and bi-weekly Book studies.
- **Summer 2020:** Fill the Pick-Up: GPR and Living Grace collected food for the Barnesville Food Pantry and REACH Food Pantry during Outdoor Worship Services on the lawn of Rollag Lutheran. The pick-up was filled with food and household items, along with cash. We gathered hundreds of pounds of food and cash to help feed our hungry neighbors.
- **Transformational Ministry:** Even before the pandemic started, a group (from GPR/Living Grace) began working with the Northwestern MN Synod and Rev. Rick Morse to ask key questions and look to our future and how we might be a transformative church, addressing the needs of our communities and congregations. We had great conversation and started dreaming of what our future could look like.

2021 Highlights:

- Living Grace continued Worshipping online (YouTube, Facebook link and website) only through June, 2021. We also offered a Thursday evening Fellowship gathering time on Zoom.
- June 2021: Began worshipping in-person on Tuesday evenings, returned to Sunday mornings in October.
- On-going: Continued partnership with GPR to provide online worship services. Phase One of Online Ministry with GPR/LG Partnership was to set up Rollag with livestreaming equipment/software through financial donations and memorial gifts. Phase Two will include developing a Mobile Recording Unit to use at Gran, Park, and Living Grace, and outdoors at Rollag.
- **Women's Mutual Ministry** Online Book Study continued through 2021 meeting 2x/month. An Advent Prayer Retreat was held at Rollag Lutheran.

Our Ministry and mission continues...where will the next 10 years lead us? This is what Jesus instructed his disciples – and us – to do: This is what our future is focused on:
